## **RESOLUTION NO. 14-07**

## RESOLUTION OF THE SAN GABRIEL VALLEY COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS (SGVCOG) SUPPORTING THE I-210 CONNECTED CORRIDORS PILOT PROJECT

WHEREAS, Connected Corridors, a Caltrans-led project, is in the initial stages of planning and development;

WHEREAS, Connected Corridors will use new and existing Integrated Corridor Management technologies to address both the freeway and arterial traffic;

WHEREAS, the Connected Corridors goals include decreasing recurrent bottlenecks and vehicle delays, improving travel time reliability, and reducing the number and severity of accidents in the corridor as well as improving inter-jurisdictional and inter-agency coordination;

WHEREAS, the individual stakeholders in the I-210 pilot corridor (the cities, county, transit agencies, Los Angeles County Department of Coroner, and local law enforcement) from Pasadena to Duarte, will work to build consensus on addressing congestion for the betterment of the entire network;

WHEREAS, the Connected Corridors team is in the process of engaging stakeholders in the San Gabriel Valley to gain participation and support for the project; and

WHEREAS, Integrated Corridor Management strategies, coordinated transportation planning efforts, and the incorporation of bus and rail transit into congestion management solutions are supported by the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments hereby:

- 1. Supports the goals and objectives of the Connected Corridors project;
- 2. Endorses the stakeholders working together on the I-210 Connected Corridors pilot with the intent of reducing incidents and delays, and improving reliability on the I-210 pilot corridor (and other future corridors in the San Gabriel Valley); and
- 3. Agrees to participate and coordinate with the corridor partners to ensure the success of the Connected Corridors project.
